



EVERYONE IS A SECURITY MONITOR. WE STAY SAFE TOGETHER.

Report suspicious activity ~ Write down license plate, make/model/color of suspicious vehicles ~ Get descriptions of occupants and take photos if it can be done discreetly ~ Report suspicious video/photography or unusual requests ~ Report unattended bags or objects ~ Report suspicious mail or packages to officials immediately and isolate the item if possible

AT ALL TIMES...

Know phone numbers for emergency services and reporting suspicious activity ~ Program these numbers into cell phones:

Police: 110 Ambulance: 112 Fire: 112 Eagle Eyes: 06371-47-2050

Know how to use the local phone system and carry payphone change ~ Vary restaurants ~ Alternate shopping locations ~ Do not establish any sort of pattern ~ Dress inconspicuously and try to blend in ~ Avoid crowded areas ~ Be especially alert exiting bars, restaurants, etc. ~ Know location and contact information of US Embassy and other safe locations where you can find refuge or assistance

FROM HOME TO WORK

Alternate parking places ~ Lock car when unattended ~ Look for tampering ~ Look under your auto ~ Be alert when opening door ~ Keep gas tank at least half full ~ Keep money on your fuel card ~ If possible, alter routes and avoid choke points ~ Plan "escape" routes as you drive ~ Watch out for mopeds/cycles ~ Do not pick up hitchhikers ~ Drive with windows up and doors locked

AT THE BUS STOP

Be aware of surroundings ~ Be aware of unfamiliar people at the bus stop ~ Immediately report any and all suspicious activity or threatening behavior encountered

AT FESTIVALS

Travel in small groups and vary your movements (never travel alone) ~ Always inform someone of your destination and departure/arrival/return times ~ Have a plan for safe arrival and return home ~ Try to be inconspicuous ~ Be aware of your surroundings ~ Avoid speaking loudly or drawing attention to yourself ~ Know potential safe areas ~ Carry a cell phone if possible, with emergency numbers pre-programmed ~ Ensure your vehicle is in good working order and the fuel tank full ~ Notify your command of incidents as soon as possible ~ Monitor AFN for updated information while traveling

AT DEMONSTRATIONS

Be aware of your surroundings ~ Avoid demonstrations ~ Stay away from high risk places (*Department of State website has info on high risk places in each country*) ~ If you come upon a demonstration, remain calm and disengage from the situation ~ Try to be inconspicuous ~ Try not to draw attention to yourself

AT AIRPORTS

Use concealed bag tags ~ Travel with nondescriptive luggage ~ Spend as little time as possible in airports ~ Pass through the airport security checks quickly ~ Once through security, proceed to a lounge or other open area away from baggage lockers ~ If possible, sit with your back against a wall with the public space in full view ~ Remain alert ~ Be a "people watcher"

AT HOTELS

Do not give room number to strangers ~ Choose an inside hotel room ~ Sleep away from street-side windows ~ Leave lights on when room is vacant ~ Pull curtains ~ Arrange knock signals ~ Answer telephone, "hello" ~ Do not use name and rank ~ Lock the room door before you exit ~ If confronted, have a plan of action ready ~ Occasionally exit/enter through the rear entrance ~ Keep your room key in your possession at all times
