

Alcohol Sales Restrictions Information

Background

On Dec. 7, 2012, the 86th Airlift Wing commander, Brig. Gen. C.K. Hyde, approved two memos suspending the sale of alcoholic beverages at the KMC's two 24-hour shoppettes between 1 a.m. and 6 a.m.

A 90-day trial period went into effect Dec. 9 and will allow base officials to monitor the relationship between early morning alcohol sales and alcohol related incidents.

At the end of 90 days, base officials will review its effects and decide whether to continue, cancel or modify the sales restriction. The deciding factor will be whether it contributes to the health, safety and welfare of our Airmen and their families.

Key Things to Know

This policy was instituted in support of the Air Force Chief of Staff's initiative to promote an environment of dignity, trust and respect, and in an effort to continue to encourage positive choices.

Targeting late hours will help in our effort to reduce irresponsible behavior related to alcohol consumption and aid our Airmen in making the right decision, especially during the restricted hours.
