



## **Hygiene concept for bus trips**

(IAW pertinent corona ordinances of the state of Rhineland-Palatinate)

All bus trips that are not part of the public transport must meet the following hygiene measures:

1. **Organization of the bus trip:**

- a. The contact details of all persons (surname, first name, address, telephone number) as well as the start and end times of the booked trip are to be documented after obtaining consent to enable contact person tracking and are to be kept by the tour operator for a period of one month starting on the day of the visit and subsequently destroyed in accordance with the General Data Protection Regulation. Processing of the data for other purposes is not permitted.
- b. Eating in the bus is not permitted.

2. **Person-related measures:**

- a. Persons with symptoms of a respiratory infection should be denied access.
- b. All persons must disinfect or wash their hands when entering the bus. Suitable washing facilities or disinfectant dispensers must be provided by the operator.
- c. The applicable protective measures and rules of conduct (including general rules of infection protection such as "how to sneeze correctly", classification of cold symptoms, etc.) must be identified by appropriate signs.
- d. Passengers and staff wear a mouth-nose cover if the Corona Control Ordinance in the currently valid version so requires.
- e. Drivers or cashier personnel can be protected by a plexi-glass divider. Personnel that is protected by a plexi-glass partition or other appropriate protective measures shall be exempt from the obligation to wear a mouth-nose covering.



3. Measure to be taken in the bus:

- a) Hand disinfectant, liquid soap and disposable towels are to be provided in sanitary and recreation rooms (e.g. bedroom for replacement drivers).
- b) Targeted measures must be taken to minimize the exposure of the interior to aerosols. The bus is to be adequately ventilated.

4. In general:

- a. A person present in the bus is to be appointed to ensure that the regulations are observed.
- b. In addition and upon request, the responsible authority can, in justified individual cases, allow exceptions or other hygiene requirements if a requirement under a corona ordinance is not mandatory, the level of protection appears comparable and the purpose of the corona ordinance is observed.
