

Hygiene concept for forest- and wildlife-related education events and offers

The following hygiene measures are to be observed in all forest- and wildlife-related educational activities:

1) The following measures ensure the applicable physical distance and contact restrictions:

a. The limitation of the number of persons in accordance with the Corona Control Regulation in the respectively up-to-date version.

b. A physical distance of at least 1.5 meters per person must be ensured, unless the applicable Corona Control Regulation provides otherwise. Measures must be taken to control access and maintain the physical distance requirement, including appropriately signposted path concepts.

c. If increased aerosol emissions are to be expected due to the type of activity, the minimum physical distance shall be doubled.

2. Organization of the event:

a. Contact data of all persons (Name, first name, address, telephone number) as well as the duration of the visit are to be documented after obtaining consent to enable contact person tracking and are to be kept by the operator for a period of 1 month starting on the day of the visit and subsequently destroyed in compliance with the DSGVO. Processing of the data for other purposes is not permitted.

- b. Common rooms, in particular showers and changing rooms, are exclusively for use by individuals or family members of a household.
- c. Catering may be provided in accordance with the hygiene regulations for catering trade.
- d. A distance of at least 3 meters must be maintained between information and sales stands.

3. Individual personal measures:

- a. Persons with recognizable symptoms of respiratory tract infection shall be denied access.
- b. All persons must disinfect or wash their hands when entering the event. Suitable washing facilities or disinfectant dispensers must be provided by the organizer.
- c. The applicable protective measures and rules of conduct (including general rules of infection protection such as "sneezing etiquette", classification of cold symptoms, etc.) shall be indicated by appropriate signs.
- d. Visitors and employees shall wear a mouth-nose cover, in accordance with the Corona Control Regulation in the up-to-date version.

e. It is not permitted to sign-out items to others unless they can be disinfected after use.

4. Event-related measures:

a. Hand disinfectants, liquid soap and disposable towels must be provided in sanitary, common rooms, and break rooms. The rooms must be cleaned regularly.

b. Specific measures shall be taken to minimize the exposure of rooms to aerosols. All rooms must be sufficiently ventilated.

5. General Principles:

a. An authorized person shall be appointed on site to ensure compliance with the regulations.

b. Persons who are not prepared to comply with the following rules are to be denied access or stay within the scope of the domiciliary right.

c. In addition, the responsible authority may, in justified individual cases and on application, allow exceptions or issue other hygiene requirements, provided that a specification according to CoBeLVO is not mandatory, the level of protection appears comparable, and the purpose of CoBeLVO is observed.
