Hygiene concept for theaters, cinemas, concert halls and cabarets with seating

The following hygiene measures observe for all of the above facilities:

- 1. The current distance requirement and the applicable contact restriction shall be guaranteed by the following measures:
 - a. The number of visitors can be controlled using the ticket sale that could guarantees the minimum distance of 1.5 m between each seat (within each row and in front of and behind each seat).
 - b. A distance of 1.5 m from the seats of the next visitor must be maintained between the seats, which can be booked for several people in a coherent manner in accordance with the applicable contact restrictions for people staying together in public space.
 - c. Event rooms may only be used with seating
- 2. Organization of operations:
- a. Persons with identifiable symptoms of a respiratory infection should be denied access.
- b. Reservation or registration is required. It is recommended to set up ticketing systems that flexibly allow an automatic minimum distance.
- c. Visitors and employees wear a mouth-to-nose covering, as far as the Corona Control Ordinance in the currently applicable version so requires. This only applies to performers if they have direct contact with the audience. The mask requirement does not apply on site.
- d. If a ticket is picked up at the event location, it must be ensured that the visitors at the desk keep a safety distance of 1.5 m. Cashiers can be protected by glass divider. Personnel who are protected

by a glass divider or other suitable protective measures are exempt from the obligation to wear a mouth-to-nose protection.

- e. The distance of at least 1.5 meters per person must be ensured, unless the applicable Corona Control Ordinance does not meet any other regulation. If, due to the nature of the activity, increased aerosol emissions can be expected (for example with choral singing or brass music), these activities should take place outdoors if possible; the distance requirement according to § 1 paragraph 2 applies with the proviso that the minimum distance between people must be doubled.
- f. Measures to control access and to maintain the distance requirement must be taken, including appropriately signposted route concepts. As far as possible, one-way regulations are to be made. Waiting areas (e.g. in front of sales stands and toilet facilities) must also be marked to ensure that the minimum distance is observed.
- g. For the rehearsal and demonstration operation, among other things, the current version of the administrative aid of the administrative professional association (VBG) Hamburg "SARS-CoV-2 occupational safety standard Recommendations for the stages and studios for the rehearsal sector" can be used.

3. Individual measures:

- a. Access for persons with obvious symptoms of a respiratory infection has to be denied.
- b. The applicable protective measures and rules of conduct (including general rules of protection against infection such as "sneeze label", classification of cold symptoms, etc.) must be identified by suitable signs.

- c. All persons must disinfect or wash their hands when entering the facility. Suitable washing facilities or disinfection dispensers are to be provided by the organizer.
- d. The operator of the facility is obliged to record the contact details (surname, first name, address and telephone number) of all visitors, the time of entering and leaving the facility and the participation in certain events in order to enable infections to be tracked. The contact details must be kept 1 month from the date of the visit and then destroyed in compliance with the GDPR. The data may not be used for other purposes.

4. Facility-related measures:

- a. Contact surfaces should be cleaned regularly with a greasedissolving household cleaner or disinfected with an at least limited virucidal agent.
- b. Gastronomic services are allowed under the same rules that apply to restaurants, i.e. consumption of food and drink is only allowed at tables.
- c. Special measures are to be taken to reduce the concentration of aerosols. All rooms should be ventilated every 20 minutes for 15 minutes. Constant mechanical ventilation is an alternative. In addition, the number and duration of performances per day may be reduced. A continuous air circulation in rooms is to be guaranteed. Sanutary facilities are to be ventilated continuously where ever possible.
- d. Sanitary, common and break rooms must be equipped with disinfectant, liquid soap and disposable towels The rooms are to be cleaned in short intervals. The minimum distance apllies.

5. In General:

- a. A responsible person must be appointed on site to ensure compliance with the regulations.
- b. Persons who are not prepared to comply with these rules are to be denied access within the framework of the domestic authority.

c. In addition and upon request, the responsible authority can, in justified individual cases, allow exceptions or other hygiene requirements if a requirement under a corona ordinance is not mandatory, the level of protection appears comparable and the purpose of the corona ordinance is observed.
