

Hygiene Concept for Indoor Trade Fairs and Specialty Markets

The following hygiene measures must be observed for all indoor trade fairs and specialty markets:

1. The current distance requirement and the applicable contact restriction are guaranteed by the following measures:
 - a. Access restrictions ensure that there is a maximum of one person per 10 sqm of sales or visitor space. In the building, the distance requirement and the person limit (1 person per 10 sqm) must be observed, unless each visitor has a fixed, allocated space. In this case, compliance with the distance requirement is decisive.
 - b. The distance of at least 1.5 meters per person must be ensured, unless the applicable Corona Control Ordinance does not meet any other regulation. Measures to control access and to maintain the distance requirement must be taken, including appropriately signposted route concepts. As far as possible, one-way regulations are to be made. Waiting areas (e.g. in front of sales stands and toilet facilities) must also be marked to ensure that the minimum distance is observed.
2. Organization of implementation:
 - a. The company is obliged to record the contact details of all persons entering the facility (last name, first name, address, telephone number), as well as the time of entering and leaving the facility. These are to be kept for a period of 1 month starting on the day of the visit and then destroyed in compliance with the GDPR. The data may not be used for other purposes.
 - b. The use of sanitary facilities is permitted taking into account the required protective measures.
 - c. Catering may take place under the specifications for the catering trade.
 - d. The permissible time extension of the event is based on the applicable Corona Control Ordinance.
 - e. There must be a distance of at least 3 meters between information and sales stands.
3. Individual measures:
 - a. Persons with recognizable symptoms of a respiratory infection are usually to be denied access.
 - b. All persons must disinfect or wash their hands when entering the event. Suitable washing facilities or disinfection dispensers are to be provided by the organizer.

- c. The applicable protective measures and rules of conduct (including general rules for protection against infection such as "sneeze label", classification of cold symptoms, etc.) must be identified by suitable signs.
 - d. Visitors and employees wear a mouth-to-nose cover, as far as the Corona Control Ordinance in the currently applicable version so requires.
 - e. Cashiers can be protected by a partition. Personnel who are protected by a partition or other suitable protective measures are exempt from the obligation to wear a mouth / nose protection.
 - f. If there are more than 10 people, a minimum distance of 1.5 meters from other people must be observed; in sports or other activities, that lead to increased respiratory emissions, a distance of at least 3 meters from other people must be maintained.
 - g. The lending of items is not permitted unless they can be disinfected after use.
4. Institutional measures:
- a. Hand sanitizers, liquid soap and disposable towels are to be provided in sanitary, common and break rooms. The rooms must be cleaned regularly.
 - b. Specific measures must be taken to minimize the exposure of rooms to aerosols. All rooms must be adequately ventilated.
5. The general rule:
- a. A responsible person must be appointed on site to ensure compliance with the regulations.
 - b. Persons who are not willing to comply with these rules are to be denied access or residence within the framework of the house right.
 - c. For the rehearsal and demonstration operation, among other things, the current version of the administrative aid (VBG) - Hamburg "SARS-CoV-2 occupational safety standard - recommendations for the stage and studio sector for rehearsal operation" can be used.

 - d. In addition, the competent authority can, in justified individual cases, allow exceptions or other hygiene requirements if a requirement under CoBeLVO is not mandatory, the level of protection appears comparable and the purpose of the CoBeLVO is observed.
