

Hygiene concept for extracurricular educational measures and training and further education (with the exception of holiday care measures and youth camps)

For offers in the above mentioned areas the following hygiene measures must be observed:

1. The applicable distance requirement and the applicable contact restriction are guaranteed by the following measures:

a. The distance of at least 1.5 meters per person must be ensured, unless the applicable Corona Control Ordinance provides otherwise. Measures to control access and to maintain the distance requirement must be taken, including appropriately signposted route concepts. As far as possible, one-way regulations are to be made. Waiting areas (e.g. in front of stands and toilet facilities) are also to be provided with markings to ensure compliance with the minimum distance.

2. Organization of implementation

a. The contact traceability of the people present must be ensured. Contact details (surname, first name, address, telephone number) that ensure that the person can be reached, as well as the date and time the person was present, must be collected by the educational institution in compliance with data protection regulations and kept for a period of one month; after the retention period has expired, the data must be deleted immediately.

b. The use of sanitary facilities is permitted if the necessary protective measures are observed.

c. Catering may take place under the guidelines for gastronomy.

d. A distance of at least 3 meters must be maintained between information and sales stands.

e. For sport and exercise in public and private facilities outside of general and vocational schools, the corresponding hygiene concepts for the area of sport apply.

f. The music hygiene concept applies to music programs in public and private institutions outside of general and vocational schools.

G. Food preparation can take place again with particularly strict consideration of the relevant legal bases for food hygiene, a "good hygiene practice" (GHP) and the corresponding HACCP concept.

3. Individual measures:

a. People with recognizable symptoms of a respiratory infection should be denied access.

b. All persons must disinfect or wash their hands when entering the event. Suitable washing facilities or disinfectant dispensers must be available.

c. The applicable protective measures and rules of conduct (including general rules for protection against infection such as "sneeze etiquette", classification of cold symptoms, etc.) are to be identified by means of suitable signs.

d. Visitors and employees wear a mouth and nose cover, as far as the Corona Control Ordinance in the currently applicable version orders.

e. Personnel can be protected by a plexi divider. Personnel protected by a divider is exempted from any obligation to wear a mouth and nose protection.

f. The loan of objects is not permitted if they cannot be disinfected after use.

4. Facility-related measures:

a. Hand disinfectants, liquid soap and disposable towels are to be made available in sanitary, common and break rooms. The rooms must be cleaned regularly.

b. Specific measures must be taken to minimize the pollution of rooms with aerosols. All rooms must be adequately ventilated.

5. In general:

a. An authorized person responsible for compliance with the regulations on site must be appointed by the institution

b. Persons who are not prepared to comply with these rules are to be refused entry or residence within the framework of house rules.

c. With regard to the occupational safety of employees, reference is made to the SARS-CoV2 occupational safety standard of the BMAS.

e. In addition, in justified individual cases, the competent authority can allow exceptions or issue other hygiene requirements, provided that a specification according to the CoBeLVO is not mandatory, the level of protection appears comparable and the purpose of the CoBeLVO is included
