

Hygiene concept for flea markets and jumble sales, special markets, fun fairs and similar outdoor markets (does not apply to weekly markets)

1. The current distance requirement and applicable contact restrictions are guaranteed by the following measures:

- a. The area is to be clearly delimited by a barrier and provided with a central entrance and a central exit. Access control must be carried out by setting up fixed barriers, by installing security guards, or by using flutter stripes.
- b. The distance requirement and the limitation of persons (1 person per 5 square meter) must be observed on the premises.
- c. The distance of at least 1.5 meters per person must be ensured, unless the applicable Corona Control Ordinance does not state anything else. Measures to control access and to maintain the distance requirement must be taken, including appropriately signposted route concepts. As far as possible, one-way regulations are to be made. Waiting areas (e.g. in front of sales stands and toilet facilities) are also to be marked with signs to maintain the minimum distance.

2. Organization of the site:

- a. There must be a minimum distance of 6 m between rows of stalls; the lateral distance between the stands must be at least 3 m.
- b. The provision of food and drinks may take place under the specifications for the gastronomy rules.

3. Individual measures:

- a. Organizers, providers and visitors wear a mouth-to-nose covering, as far as the Corona Control Ordinance in the currently applicable version so requires.
- b. For event staff, providers and visitors, the applicable protective measures and rules of conduct (including general rules for protection against infection such as “sneeze label”, classification of cold symptoms, etc.) must be identified by means of suitable signs.
- c. All people must disinfect or wash their hands when entering the event. Suitable washing facilities or disinfection dispensers are to be provided by the organizers.

4. Institutional measures:

- a. Persons with recognizable symptoms of a respiratory infection should be denied access.
- b. Hand sanitizers, liquid soap and disposable towels must be provided in sanitary, common and break rooms.
- c. Specific measures must be taken to minimize the exposure of rooms to aerosols. All rooms (e.g. sanitary facilities) must be adequately ventilated.

5. In general:

- a. A responsible person must be appointed on site to ensure compliance with the regulations.
- b. Persons who are not willing to comply with these rules are to be denied access or residence within the framework of the house right.
- c. In addition, the competent public authority can, in justified individual cases, allow exceptions or other hygiene requirements if a requirement under CoBeLVO is not mandatory, the level of protection appears comparable and the purpose of the CoBeLVO is observed.
