Retiring or Resigning from a SOFA protected job -Staying in Germany What to do?

Here are your options when retiring in Germany. If you intend to stay in Germany for 90 days or less past the date your SOFA status expires, you must either:

1) depart the *Schengen area on or prior to the day their SOFA status expires and travel to a non-Schengen country (i.e., UK) before officially re-entering the Schengen area as a tourist to start the 90day short-term stay under the visa waiver program. The entry stamp marks your official entry for the 90day tourist stay.

2) obtain a 90-day tourist residence permit (Aufenthaltstitel) at the local Ausländerbehörde prior to the expiration of your SOFA status. This is permissable per the *Allgemeine Verwaltungsvorschrift zum Aufenthaltsgesetz*, §6.1.8.2. and you can travel throughout the Schengen area during those 90 days.

3) obtain a

Grenzuebertrittsbescheinigung (border crossing certificate) from the Ausländerbehörde if you are departing Germany shortly after the SOFA status ends and you have a confirmed departure date.

Note:

* Schengen Area signifies a zone where now 27 European countries, abolished their internal borders, for the free and unrestricted movement of people, in harmony with common rules for controlling external borders and fighting criminality by strengthening the common judicial system and police cooperation.

Schengen Area covers most of <u>the</u> <u>EU countries</u>, except Ireland and the countries that are soon to be part of the Schengen Area: Romania, Bulgaria, and Cyprus. Although not members of the EU, countries like Norway, Iceland, Switzerland and Lichtenstein are also part of the Schengen zone.

Space Force or United States Space Force (USSF)



The United States Space Force is a separate and distinct branch of the armed

services, organized under the Department of the Air Force in a manner very similar to how the Marine Corps is organized under the Department of the Navy. As a new military service, the U.S. Space Force will leverage the Department of the Air Force for more than 75 percent of its enabling functions to significantly reduce cost and avoid duplication. The Department of the Air Force will provide support functions that includes logistics, base operating support, IT support, audit agencies, etc.

TRICARE Prices Have Increased for 2023



Military families and Retirees will pay more for Tricare in 2023. The increases for many using Tricare Prime and Tricare Select will mainly be to their annual enrollment fees and deductibles, with smaller increases coming for co-payments for medical services. Note that there are no enrollment fees for active duty families, but Retirees will see an increase in 2023. Many of the Tricare cost changes depend on which "Tricare group" a military member is in. One's group is determined by when they first entered the military. Group A consists of those who entered service before Jan. 1, 2018, while Group B covers those who entered after that date.

Group A Retirees enrolled in Tricare Select will see their annual enrollment fees increase from \$317 to \$345 for a family, and from \$158 to \$171.96 for an individual. Group A retirees using Tricare Prime will see the enrollment fees for a family plan increase from \$647 to \$703.92, while the single plan goes from \$323 to \$351.96 annually.

Retirees in Tricare Group B will also see larger increases. <u>Deductibles</u> will also increase in 2023. A deductible is the amount those using Tricare Select must pay out-of-pocket before Tricare makes any payments.

Group A active-duty family members and Retirees will see no changes to the deductible amount. But a military member with the rank of E-4 or below in Group B will see their family deductible increase from \$112 to \$121; families with sponsors E-5 and above in Group B will see their deductible rise from \$336 to \$365.

Most <u>co-payments</u> also will go up slightly in 2023. Tricare Select users with a family in Group A will see the cost of a primary care visit increase from \$24 to \$25. The primary care copay for Group B family members will rise from \$16 to \$18. Retirees using Tricare Select will see a primary care visit go from \$24 to \$34, while those using Tricare Prime will pay \$24 on2023, up from the current \$22.

The <u>catastrophic cap</u> is your maximum out-of-pocket cost for all health care provided each year; it limits your liability if a member of your family has a serious illness or injury. Once you have paid this much in co-payments or pharmacy charges during the year, the rest will be paid in full by Tricare.

This cap will also increase in 2023. Group A Retirees using Tricare Select will see it increase from \$3,706 to \$4,028. The cap for active-duty members in Group A who have Tricare Prime will remain the same -- \$3,000 annually, those in Group B will see it increase from \$3,921 to \$4,262. For more details go to:

In 1951 the Americans started to build Sembach Air Base; it was finished in 1953 and the last planes were flown from there in 1995 when the airstrip and hangars were returned to the German government. The area called Heuberg (administrative and housing area) remained under control of the Air Force and the base was renamed Sembach Annex. Then in 2010 the US Army took over control and it was re-named Sembach Kaserne. One facility at Sembach that moved from Coleman Barracks (Mannheim) in 2010 was the United States Army Correctional Facility".

Foreign Medical Program:

The Veterans Administration (VA) provides medical services to eligible Veterans living or traveling abroad through the Foreign Medical Program (FMP). Through this program, FMP will pay for health care services, medications, and durable medical equipment for service-connected and related and aggravating disorders. VA may permit foreign medical care for any ailiment if you are enrolled in the VA Vocational Rehabilitation Program (Title 38, U.S. Code, Chapter 31).



Enrolling in FMP is simple. Fill out the FMP Registration Form (VA Form

10-7959f-1) and send to VHA Office of Integrated Veteran Care. (Fillable

PDFs can be completed online, saved and printed.)

You may also send your full name, mailing address, address of residence (including country), and VA claim number to the VHA Office of Integrated Veteran Care. To enroll in FMP, mail your information to:

VHA Office of Integrated Veteran Care Foreign Medical Program (FMP) P.O. Box 469061 Denver, CO 80246-9061

The VA will confirm your serviceconnected disabilities and send you a benefits authorization letter, which outlines the medical conditions the VA will cover.

two areas of the tax law that require your attention are **income tax and inheritance**.

Income Tax for this past year 2022 is a task we all have to take care for every new year with a deadline usually 15 April for filing with the IRS. If you have to abide by the German-American bilateral tax treaty then you will have to follow the German guidance on when and where to file. Be aware that the new IRS Froms 8833 have been revised and you should use the latest ones dated Dec 2022.

German Reporting American NEWS



"Tüchter's 51 States", the USA newsletter of RHEINPFALZ, will be published this Wednesday for the 20th time. Launched in January, the email, which is sent every 14 days, now reaches subscribers in all 16 federal states and numerous US states - on both coasts and also in the Midwest of the USA.

The digital RHEINPFALZ offer is also used in other European countries such as Great Britain and France - and recently even in China. This is shown by reader market analyses.

Why the name "Tüchter's 51 States"? The author of the newsletter is RHEINPFALZ editor Ilja Tüchter. The 50-year-old journalist, who has been reporting on American topics for more than two decades, writes about the fifty states of the USA and America's role in Rhineland-Palatinate. More than 50,000 Americans live there - the German region with US military bases like Ramstein Air Base is something like a 51st state in the USA.

The newsletter is based on current events, but always keeps an eye on the long lines of a story. How is the US troop presence in Europe developing? Why do millions of US students take the oath of flag every day and what can Germans learn from it?

The 20th issue is about the anniversary of the attacks of September 11, 2001 and the domestic political agenda of the Biden government. <u>Register now</u> <u>and read "Tüchter's 51 States"</u> <u>every 14 days on Wednesdays in</u> <u>the late afternoon.</u>

American Kindergraves

From 1952 to 1971, 451 American infants who died at birth or shortly after birth at the American military hospital at Landstuhl or at nearby civilian hospitals, were buried in the Kaiserslautern main cemetery cooperation with the Kaiserslautern Military Community and Kaiserslautern city officials. Floral wreaths are placed at the front monument and a candle lighting ceremony takes place in memory of the children. A flower and an American flag are placed



(Waldfriedhof) adjacent to the U.S. Army Daenner Kaserne.

The Ramstein Area Chief's Group (US Air Force E-9's) assumed this role. The cemetery management agreed to move the gravesites to a new area in the heart of the cemetery and drafted a new lease. The Ramstein Area Chief's Group serves as the entrusted agent for the lease.

Each spring following Mother's Day, a memorial ceremony is sponsored by the KKMF in at each grave marker. The Air Force Jr. ROTC Color Guard leads the procession to the gravesite. The KKMF receives no funding from the US government. The upkeep of the Kindergraves is possible through the generous monetary donations of the local community. The Ramstein Area Chief's Group designate organizes volunteers to accomplish yearround maintenance (grass cutting, edging, trimming, stone cleaning). Here is some more Trivia from around the KMC

The castle barracks is one of the oldest barracks. The building was part of the "Central Prison", which was shut down in 1907 and which in turn stood on part of the former Casimir Palace. The building was used as barracks during World War I. It was used as the city's administration building from the 1950s until it was demolished for the construction of the town hall. The Daenner barracks was built in 1937. It is named after Lieutenant General Rudolf Daenner, who commanded during World War I. Here is an old map:

The barracks were taken over by the Americans in 1951. Over the past 50- years it has been home to several different agencies.
