Lt. Col. Matthew M. Andrews is the 496th Air Base Squadron and US Forces Installation Commander, Morón Air Base, Spain. He is the senior airfield authority (SAA) and base operations support-Integrator (BOS-I) for all U.S. personnel. Lt. Col. Andrews commands a total force of 605 military, civilian, and contracted personnel from across 35 career fields who operate and enable the Morón power-projection platform via installation functions including: Airfield Operations, Aerial Port, Civil Engineering, Communications, Contracting, Logistics, Finance, Force Support, Security Forces, Chaplain, and other functions. Currently, the base enables the Special Purpose Marine Air-Ground Task Force Crisis Response-Africa and Operation JUNIPER MICRON missions while partnering with the Spanish Air Force's 11th Wing, Unidad Militar de Emergencias, the Second Air Deployment Support Squadron, and additional transient operations

Lt. Col. Andrews received his commission upon graduation from Pennsylvania State University in 2004. He completed undergraduate navigator training in 2005 and served as an instructor and evaluator navigator in the C-130 Hercules. Lt. Col. Andrews is a June 2010 graduate of the USAF Weapons School where he also served three years on cadre. His participation in both combat and peacetime joint operations include Operations ENDURING FREEDOM, IRAQI



FREEDOM, ASSURED DELIVERY, JOINT FORGE, DAMAYAN, SAHAYOGI HAAT, FREEDOM'S SENTINEL, and RESOLUTE SUPPORT. Prior to his current position, Lt. Col. Andrews was the Director of Operations of the 621 Mobility Support Operations Squadron responsible for the worldwide operational employment of 51 Air Mobility Liaison Officers aligned with Army, Marine and Special Operations units.

Lt. Col. Andrews is a senior navigator with 2,500 hours in the C-130 and T-1.
