

# **COLONEL LELAND K. "HOLIE" COWIE II**

Col Leland K. "Holie" Cowie II is the Commander, 435th Air Ground Operations Wing, Ramstein Air Base, Germany. The wing is comprised of three groups, 11 squadrons, and four detachments with more than 1,400 personnel at 11 installations in Germany, Italy, Poland, the United States, and other partner nations across Europe. The Airmen of this wing provide joint Airpower integration, information superiority, and airspace awareness; build expeditionary airfields on demand; enable multi-theater sustainment and support; deliver premier specialty training; build partner capacity and respond to worldwide contingency operations.

Col Cowie is a 1998 graduate of the U.S. Air Force Academy, earned pilot wings in 1999 from Euro-NATO Joint Jet Pilot Training, and qualified as a Joint Terminal Attack Controller at Fort Sill Army Installation, Oklahoma in 2004. He previously commanded at the squadron and group levels; and has combat experience in three weapon systems: Air Force Special Warfare in Operations IRAQI FREEDOM and ENDURING FREEDOM-PHILLIPPINES, MQ-1B evaluator pilot in Operations ENDURING FREEDOM-AFGHANISTAN and INHERENT RESOLVE, and F-15C flight lead in Operations NOBLE EAGLE and SOUTHERN WATCH. Col Cowie's previous staff assignments include the Joint Staff, Air Force



Secretariat, Headquarters Air Force, and Joint Strike Fighter Program Office. He is acquisitions Level I certified for Program Management and Planning, Research, Development, and Engineering. Prior to his current assignment, he served as the Director of Special Warfare for the Deputy Chief of Staff of the Air Force for Operations.
