# **COVID-19 Event and Gathering** Force Health Protection Recommendations

This documents outlines general force health protection recommendations to promote healthy behaviors and maintain a healthy environment to reduce the risk of transmission of Coronavirus 2019 (COVID-19) when large events and gatherings are held. This guidance is not all-inclusive and should be tailored to the event being held, as well as any Host Nation guidance that may be applicable.

# **Enforcement of Gathering Restrictions**

- Organizers will implement an event registration or method for attendees to sign-up to attend.
  - Individuals should not be permitted to participate without advance reservation. Reservations ensure gathering limitations do not exceed prescribed limit
- Maintain attendance logs for at minimum 14 days after the event to aid case investigations conducted by the Installation Public Health Office if an individual tests positive for COVID-19 after the event.
- Offer online/virtual attendance options (i.e., Zoom, Microsoft Teams).
- Display a set of clearly visible rules that outline conditions of entry into the event or gathering.
- Announce any COVID-19 restrictions or protocol at the beginning of the event.

# **Physical Distancing**

- Rearrange seating areas, tables, chairs, benches, etc., and/or remove seats to allow for a minimum of six feet of physical distance between individuals or households.
- Limit the number of individuals at a single table to a household unit or those who already work together within a unit or section.
- Do not allow lines or crowds to form near high utilized spaces (i.e., restrooms, entrances, exits) without maintaining a distance of 6 feet from others. It may be helpful to post signs or markers to help attendees maintain the appropriate social distance of at least 6 feet.

# **Required Use of Face Coverings**

- Venues should post signs and information clarifying what mask requirements apply.
- On-base events: Follow current DoD guidance for mask wear on DoD Installations.
  - Vaccinated: Fully vaccinated people do not need to wear a mask in indoor or outdoor settings.
    - Events should follow Installation and Host Nation guidance.
    - Events may opt to have fully vaccinated people wear masks if it is occurring in a location with substantial or high transmission, or other attendees are either immunocompromised or unvaccinated.
  - Unvaccinated or refuse to provide vaccination information: Masks required, regardless if the event is indoors or outdoors.
- Off-base events: Events should follow Host Nation guidance for mask requirements, to include who exemptions apply to and type of mask that must be worn.

#### **Individual Control Measures and Screenings**

- As needed, conduct temperature screen and/or symptom checks of attendees
- Attendees or volunteers should not attend or participate if any of the following apply:
  - Individuals who are ill.
  - Individuals who are pending the results of a COVID-19 test.
  - Individuals who have tested positive for COVID-19 within the preceding 10 days.
  - Individuals who are on quarantine due to being identified as a close contact to an individual confirmed to have COVID-19.
  - o Individuals who are on quarantine due to post-travel requirements

# Verification of Vaccination Status or Testing

- The meeting organization must outline how proof of vaccination status or negative test results will be obtained for each attendee.
  - All attendees must provide proof of vaccination.
  - Attendees who are not fully vaccinated or decline to provide information regarding their status must provide a negative test no earlier than 72 hours prior to the event, and at least weekly if the event is greater than one week in duration.

### **Cleaning and Disinfection**

- Provide hand sanitizer if soap and water are not readily available for handwashing.
- Clean common touch surfaces at the venue before and after the event.
- Supplies should be made available for routine cleaning and disinfection of frequently touched surfaces in between use, as applicable to the event.

# Food and Drink

While there is no evidence that COVID-19 spreads by food, individuals congregating around food service areas or while dining pose a risk.

- Use disposable food service items including utensils and dishes.
- Opt to have individuals serve food versus self-serve options.
- Hand sanitizer should be available prior to perform hand hygiene where food service occurs.
- Fundraiser requests involving food must follow normal protocols outlined by Installation Force Support Squadron.
- All food events are subject to inspection IAW AFI 48-116, Food Safety Program.
